Foundation Paper Piecing

Description

Foundation Paper Piecing sometimes just called “Paper Piecing”, or FPP for short, is not the same as English Paper Piecing. Foundation paper piecing uses paper as a foundation on which to machine sew pieces of fabric together to create precise points and connect tiny pieces of fabric to create intricate designs.

In this class you will learn how to piece together a quilt block using several techniques for Foundation Paper Piecing. You will start with a simple block and then progress to more complex blocks with multiple parts. Most of the blocks you will make in this class will be 6” square and smaller so that we will have time to make several with varying degrees of complexity.

Supply list

- A small ruler, (3 inches wide by 12 inches long is best)
- The “Add-A-Quarter” ruler
- Optional: The “Add-an-Eighth” ruler
- Rotary Cutter – 45mm or 28mm with a sharp blade
- Scissors – for cutting fabric
- Scissors – for cutting paper
- Seam Ripper
- Thread – neutral colors for dark and light fabrics 50W is best
- Fabric – scraps of various colors, 8”x 8” and larger are ok.
- A Pencil
- Optional: Water Soluble Glue Stick
- A sewing machine
- Optional: open toe presser foot so you can see your needle as you sew.

I will supply several printed Foundation Paper Piecing patterns for you to sew. If you have a pattern and have questions on how to begin, you are welcome to bring it in and I will get you started.
