

Beginner's Fusible Applique (using Accuquilt)

With Jackie Vujcich

In this technique class will make plenty of hearts or flowers using my Accuquilt machine and die-cuts. You can copy my ideas or create your own. Time permitting, you can start stitching the pieces down.

Fabric: Choose either hearts or flowers please and bring appropriate fabrics

Hearts

Background- 1 fat quarter (suggest a neutral like white, cream, black or gray).

Reds/pinks/heart prints- bring 5-6 fat quarters (or large scraps)

*Backing/Binding: $\frac{3}{4}$ yard

*Batting: 20" x 24"

*won't be used in class but just in case you want to purchase all at once)

Flowers

Background- 1 fat quarter

Stems/leaves- 1 fat quarter or large scrap

Flower petals/centers- bring 3-4 fat quarters (or large scraps)

*Backing/Binding: $\frac{3}{4}$ yard

*Batting: 20" x 24"

*won't be used in class but just in case you want to purchase all at once)

Notions:

Sewing machine in good working order

Regular sewing notions

Fusible web (such as Steam a Seam 2-light or regular OR Wonder Under) – 1 to 2 yards

Quilting thread(s)-colors to match or highly contrast with your applique fabrics (and bobbins too)

Rotary cutter and ruler 6" x 24"

Optional:

Open -toed walking foot for applique work (I can't begin to tell you how helpful this foot is)

PRIOR to class: Please wash and iron all fabric. This gets the sizing out so that the fusible sticks better.
