

Panels Converge

1 session of 4 hours

Do you have a preprinted panel and not quite sure how to incorporate it into your work? Only 4 chunks of material and a few borders and you'll have a gorgeous piece of work. It looks like you've slaved overcutting tiny squares of all sizes when actually all it takes is a few strips of fabric.

Fabric:

4 coordinating colors*-one fat quarter of EACH

**Inner border-1/4 to 1/2 yard (optional)

**Outer borders-3/4 to 1 yard

*It's helpful to have some of the same colors in each coordinating fabric to help them blend or "converge" better. Batiks work very well for this purpose but are not absolutely necessary. I have used a panel as one of the coordinating fabrics. I had to increase the amount of fabric so that the other 3 coordinates had the same dimensions as the panel (i. e. I purchased 20" x 24" pieces to match the panel that was 20" x 24"). **FYI-** I do have this panel in addition to others for sale.

**If your panel is larger than 20" x 24", consider purchasing the larger amounts for the border fabric

Notions:

Sewing machine in good working order (don't forget foot controller and plug) -it must be capable of sewing an accurate 1/4"

Seam ripper, machine needles, pins, thread- neutral

Rotary cutter (a personal cutting mat is optional), additional blades?

Ruler 6" x 24"
